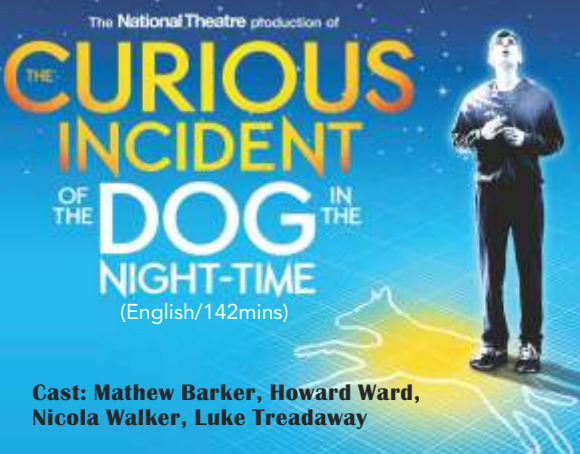

It was a challenging summer and we hope that the Habitat provided a welcome sanctuary through the heat and dust. Delayed or on time the monsoons are advancing and the Habitat calendar is singing and dancing (and talking and walking) in the rain.

Talks this month range from conservation to containment. Urban spaces get insightful and practical direction with **Dr. C.R. Babu's** lecture on *Conserving Natural Heritage in Urban Centres* in the IHC-ICRIER *Conversations on Urbanization Series* (25<sup>th</sup>), *Understanding Landscape Practices in the Architecture and Society Series* led by landscape architects **Geeta Wahi Dua** and **Brijender S. Dua** (18<sup>th</sup>), and organic farming expert **Kapil Mandawewala's** session on sustainable urban farming methods that can transform balcony and terrace gardening into opportunities to grow one's own food (2<sup>nd</sup>). Leading journalist and Founding Editor of the *Wire Siddharth Varadarajan* delivers the *IHC-SPS Changing Asia Lecture* surveying the 10-year-progress since India and United States signed the historic nuclear deal (9<sup>th</sup>) and Historian **Dr. Srinath Raghavan's** latest book, *The Most Dangerous Place: A History of the United States in South Asia*, regarded as the definitive history of US involvement in South Asia, comes under discussion (23rd). In the monthly *IHC-RIS-CEFIPRA STIP Forum*, **Prof. Ashutosh Sharma**, Secretary, Department of Science & Technology, Govt. of India, discusses the future of Science, Technology & Innovation (13<sup>th</sup>).

The **Habitat Film Club** is joining hands with the **High Commission of Canada** in bringing the film club members a special package of Canadian films (18<sup>th</sup>-21<sup>st</sup>). The three features and one documentary film planned as part of *Reel Canada Fest* offers a refreshing break for those eager to catch a slice of life in Canada, which of late has intervened admirably in the world stage setting the tone for social inclusion and celebration of ethnic diversity.

Theatre this month includes **Sita Raina's** show on the enduring legacy of S.D. Burman (21<sup>st</sup>) and O.P. Nayar (22nd), **Miran Production's** Stand Up Comedy with a difference *Kavis and Komedy* (15th), the story of an uncommon maid *Sakubai* by **Monika Misra** (7th), **Nicky Chandam's** *Wari* celebrating folktales (8th), and **Swati Mohan's** experimental contemporary dance production *Shenpa* (29th). The NLive Broadcast of the murder-mystery *The Curious Incident of the Dog in the Night* is a must-watch (14th)! And **Mahmood Farooqui's** tribute to the Karna of Mahabharata returns (28th & 29th).

The music and dance panel brims with excellent performances. Not to miss **IHC Music Club** special in which vocalist **Aastha Goswami** will be presenting a lecture-demonstration on the folk and semi-classical repertoire of Monsoon songs (7<sup>th</sup>), and Bharatanatyam dancer **Preethi Ramaprasad's** performance in the *Habitat Concert Series* (17<sup>th</sup>). Opera at *Habitat Series* curated and introduced by **Sunit Tandon** screens French composer Charles Gounod's opera based on *Romeo and Juliet*, Shakespeare's immortal play about the young star-crossed lovers (11<sup>th</sup>).

We are delighted to invite registrations from our young friends (7-10 year olds) for the workshop on making comics at the *Habitat Children's Book Reading Forum* (14<sup>th</sup>), and for the *IHC Art Walk* for 10-18 year olds in the National Museum led by art educator, **Shagufa Siddhi** (22<sup>nd</sup>).
